Ken was the chair of the meeting and Tish was the recording secretary.

Ken called the meeting to order at 10 AM, welcoming everyone

The financial report from September 30, 2020 was presented to council, no one had questions on the report, however Al Foster did have a question on one of the budget tracking sheets and that question was answered.

Ken advised the meeting that we were meeting today to decide on allocating the remaining portion of our budget and review three proposals

- 1. Little Atlin Lake winter project,
- 2. Having a qualified person do a butchering of moose/caribou demonstration/course.
- 3. Council engagement proposal involving placing of fish cleaning tables, and educational materials.

Much discussion ensued and more ideas came up and were addressed, it was decided that a butchering talk would not be had due to concerns with covid and close proximity. On the council engagement Ken was asked to gather information on the involvement of YG and possibly BFLF consulting. This will be finalised at the November 12 meeting.

There was a short discussion about a meat wastage/usage brochure that CTRRC produced a few years ago and it was suggested that we should maybe revitalize it along with the jerky seasoning giveaway. Tish said she would look into this.

Don brought up that a citizen from Marsh Lake mentioned that there were a lot of deer mortalities on the Alaska Highway this year. More near the Lewes River bridge and some around Marsh Lake. It was suggested to bring up with Lars if it was possible to turn on the nice highway signs that were installed this spring with a warning to people to be aware of wildlife on highway.

This would be brought up with Lars later when he is in attendance. Jacque brought up that most mortalities on highways are caused by excessive speeds of the drivers.

Ken suggested to council that we should find out what status YG is at doing the highway mortality work. Lars advised that because of Covid the contractor could not travel to the Yukon but that YG had just recently contracted Anthony Clevenger to do a study. YG would send data to Anthony he would work with that and report back to YG.

Lars wanted to discuss with council what their ideas were on the moose management workshop, timeline etc. Don said should have the survey information presented in a way public can understand then have community meetings and have local and traditional knowledge content of the workshop. This would likely happen in late 2021 after the survey is complete.

The next meeting date was set for November 12, 2020 at Mount Lorne.
